Hal Hinson of the Washington Post wrote, "Ultimately, *The Usual Suspects* may be too clever for its own good. The twist at the end is a corker, but crucial questions remain unanswered." Britain's The Independent also praised the film's ending: "The film's coup de grace is as elegant as it is unexpected. The whole movie plays back in your mind in perfect clarity."
