It stars Brad Pitt and Morgan Freeman, with Gwyneth Paltrow and Kevin Spacey in supporting roles. The film opens in an un-named city of near-constant rain and urban decay. The newly-transferred David Mills (Pitt) and the soon-to-retire William Somerset (Freeman) are homicide detectives who become deeply involved in the case of a sadistic serial killer. Each carefully-planned murder corresponds to one of the seven deadly sins: gluttony, greed, sloth, wrath, pride, lust, and envy. Mills becomes the unsuspecting performer of the final sin.

The film was highly acclaimed by critics and currently has an 85% rating on the movie review site Rotten Tomatoes.
